We are pleased to have as our speaker at our summer membership meeting, Margaret Linford, President of the Smyth County Genealogical Society. Margaret is a native of Marion. She received an academic scholarship to Brigham Young University in Provo, UT where she received education and training as a professional genealogist. She has over 10,000 hours of research experience, having contributed to the family histories of several notable Americans, including Michelle Obama. She is also a regional consultant for Family Search, one of the online genealogy search sites.

Several years ago, Margaret returned to her hometown of Marion with her husband Blair, a geologist for the State of VA, and their two children, Amelia (age 9) and Lauren (age 5). Immediately, upon her return she became actively involved in organizing the Smyth County Genealogical Society. The SCGS is housed at Smyth County Library. In a short time, they have developed amazing resources for genealogists in the area.

She will be speaking to us about some basic research tips, highlighting examples of her finds in Smyth County. She will also tell us how people in our area can access the numerous records stored at the Granite Mountain Records Vault in Salt Lake City via the Smyth Bland Library in Marion.



# President's Message

We have had a very busy quarter answering quite a few genealogy questions. Some of the families who have submitted inquires are: Charletons, Corners, Garretts, Hares, Frenches, and Dunns.

One very interesting question had to do with Jacob Shaffer rifles which were made in Wythe County circa 1820-1850. The question received was about a rifle signed with gold which was owned by Bland County resident Bal Hayton from Ceres, who sold it to Bill Rudder from Tazewell County, and from there the trail disappeared. However, Bland resident Howard Walker had seen the rifle and was able to describe it to the inquiring party. If any of you have seen or know anyone who has one of these rifles, please contact the office at 276-688-0088. Myth has it that Mr. Shaffer outfitted the Wythe County militia with his rifles during the Civil War.

I continue to work on the history of the **Wesendonck and Nidermaier** families who resided near Hollybrook. I have received inquiries from Berlin, Germany; Galveston, TX; Charlotte, NC, and Bristol about these two families. I welcome any information you may have about them.

I am also working with my friend, Judy Matthews, to gather documentation about *The Birth of Bland County*. We have located the original act to form Bland, dated March 30, 1861 in the vault at the Library of Virginia. We will be obtaining a copy to post at the Historical Society Office. It is handwritten and covers two large pages. Many of you have seen the transcribed version, but not the original. Bland County possessed an original copy, but it burned in the Courthouse fire in 1888.

There is much work to be done at the Historical Society. We welcome any volunteers. We particularly need volunteers to staff the gift shop on Thursdays and Fridays. We also have much work to do on processing our collection. Please come help.

We had the Jail open for the **Festival of Trails** on May 11th. Buzz Richardson graciously agreed to sit on the porch and tell some stories about the jail and some of its history (plus anything else he wanted to tell). We also started a permanent exhibit at the Jail featuring the Sheriffs of Bland County as well as many pictures of the Jail at different times during its long history of 147 years (1866 – 2013). We opened the front group of six cells in the annex built in 1953 for viewing during the Festival.

Harold Ramsey, committee chairman of the Jail Renovation, has set up the shelves in the upstairs storage room to house our donated items and our large collection of **Bland Messengers**.

As some of you may know, we lost two of our board members this quarter. Brenda King, who helped establish and run our office and gift shop and contributed numerous hours of volunteer time over the last few years resigned in April from the Board of Directors and her volunteer role. She has made enormous contributions to the Bland County Historical Society and we thank her wholeheartedly. 

The 632-page, hard-bound book contains 124 Bland County family histories that were submitted by the public and includes many photographs and a **complete index containing over 8500 names**.
