This has been another busy, productive year at the BCHS, with over **300 visitors** at the BCHS Office and over **50 requests** for family research.

The jail is looking a little better every year. Last year's clearing out all the accumulations in the jail cells from the 1954 addition was followed this year by a ServiceMaster professional cleaning. Other improvements included some painting inside and out, and some new flooring added to one room. The outside of the building was greatly enhanced by the flowers in the boxes and around the flagpole. Thanks to our "green thumb" members, Barbara Laban, Sue Ellen Tate, Molly Thompson and Pat Turner. Harold Ramsey has repaired holes and wrapped pipes to winterize this old building.

A big accomplishment this year has been organizing our **Obituary Collection**. Deserving special credit for seeing this completed are: **Barbara Laban**, **Virginia Gills** and **Barbara Kemp**, for putting in many hours collecting, pasting, and organizing these obituaries; **Ann Beardshall** for computer assistance and cross checking; and **Goldie Kiser** for entering many obits into our database. Now, thanks to **Elmer Beardshall**, that great information source is available in our office or online (index only). Elmer Beardshall has also developed a BCHS Database designed to help us to locate information in the office about our collection of Bland County genealogy and history.

We again participated in the April WCGHA Family History Institute at WCC as a vendor. Those in attendance greatly enjoyed the program and would suggest members interested in learning more about genealogy mark their calendars to attend next spring. We also took part in Ceres Day, spoke to many folks there about our shared interest in Bland County history, and sold some of our books. We had a booth at the October Festival of Leaves, where despite heavy rains we had many visitors on Saturday.

We appreciate the support from Bland County photographers for our 2015 Calendar contest with over 65 entries of Homes of Bland County. Over 75 people came to our Historical Society Office to vote for their favorites.
