### President's Message



## LONG-TIME VOLUNTEER, VIRGINIA GILLS HONORED AT THE WINTER 2016 MEMBERSHIP MEETING OF THE BLAND COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY'

Virginia "Jenny" Gills was rewarded with an honorary lifetime membership to the Bland County Historical Society at the Winter Quarterly Meeting in December. Jenny has been a faithful volunteer since the inception of BCHS in 1990. She was present at the ground-breaking of the Wolf Creek Indian Village where BCHS was previously located. Then, when we moved into our present office in the old Bland County jail, Jenny was one of the hard working volunteers who helped get the building in shape to house our collections. If you come to BCHS on a Friday afternoon, Jenny Gills is here to help you without fail.

There are too many projects to mention that Jenny has been willing to work on, but we will name a few. When we received the bundles of Bland Messengers, she helped us sort and catalog them. When it was time to clip, prepare our obituaries to place in notebooks, Jenny was there to help. In addition, she and Barbara Kemp have compiled notebooks with marriage records that we have acquired since the early marriage books were compiled. She has served in about every office we have and has always served on and regularly attended meetings of the Board of Directors. At the present time, she is Vice President for BCHS. Volunteers are at the heart of all we do and Jenny's perseverance is admired by all. Thank you Jenny Gills for being such a long and faithful volunteer in preserving the history of Bland County.

### 'Special Donation Received'

On January 13, 2017 BCHS received an email from Ken Jordan from Annapolis, MD stating that he had found among the donated books to the organization (Books for International Goodwill) for which he volunteers, the Town of Seddon (now Bland), Virginia, Minutes 1871-1894. Recognizing that these minutes might be valuable to the History of Bland County, he offered to send them to us. We quickly accepted his generous offer. The minutes are quite interesting because they report on a period for which there is not a lot of information. The 1890 U. S. Census burned in the 1920s so we don't have information about who was living in Seddon (later Bland) at the time. Our plans are to transcribe the minutes and make them available to our members and other researchers.

In the very first entry on July 10, 1877 we find out that Seddon (Bland) had a mayor. His name was W. L. Yost with George W. Bennett (Burnett), J. C. Painter, Hiram Hall and W. A. Thomas serving as commissioners. Aceles Fannon (owner of 1 of the 3 local hotels) presented an invoice to the town totaling \$6.00, for housing someone on behalf of Seddon. Other business conducted was the authorization to buy two books to keep the records of the Town. One of these record books is presumably now in our possession with records dating to 1894 thanks to Ken Jordan.

## "CERES, BLAND, ROCKY GAP & BLAND COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL YEARBOOKS NOW AVAILABLE FOR VIEWING ONLINE"

Coordinator Joe Jacobs of OCI (Oklahoma Correctional Industries), a program that teaches inmates scanning skills, contacted us last year and offered to scan our yearbooks from our three high schools at no charge. They even paid the postage for mailing the yearbooks to and from the center in Oklahoma City. We were able to take the yearbooks from our collection or borrow ones that we did not have and mail them to the OCI project for scanning. We have received the CDs with the scans and have put the links to these yearbooks online for the enjoyment of all our members and others. We will also be offering to make a CD for any yearbook that you may want to have digitally. The cost will be \$15 for the CD and mailing. ## BOBBY LITTON SPEAKS AT MARCH QUARTERLY MEMBERSHIP MEETING ON "THE BIG FOUR"

The March Quarterly Meeting was held at the Bland Library on March 11th with Bobby Litton as the guest speaker. A larger than usual crowd joined us to learn more about an event from Bland County history.

A roadside marker in front of Eagle Oak on U 52, as well as in the "History of Bland County" mentions the part that Captain Samuel Newberry played as one of the Big Four legislators who brought change to Virginia Government in the Reconstruction Era following the Civil War. Mr. Litton brought in a copy of the painting titled "The Big Four" which still hangs in the Capitol in Richmond. Despite the importance of the event, Mr. Litton said he was very surprised at how little detailed information could be found despite his widespread search which besides the usual historical search, included talking to family members and historical societies from the other Big Four. Mr. Litton did bring in a number of articles citing the events before the walk-out of The Big Four and the consequences of their action. His research was very interesting from several perspectives including the importance of maintaining historical records for the future.
