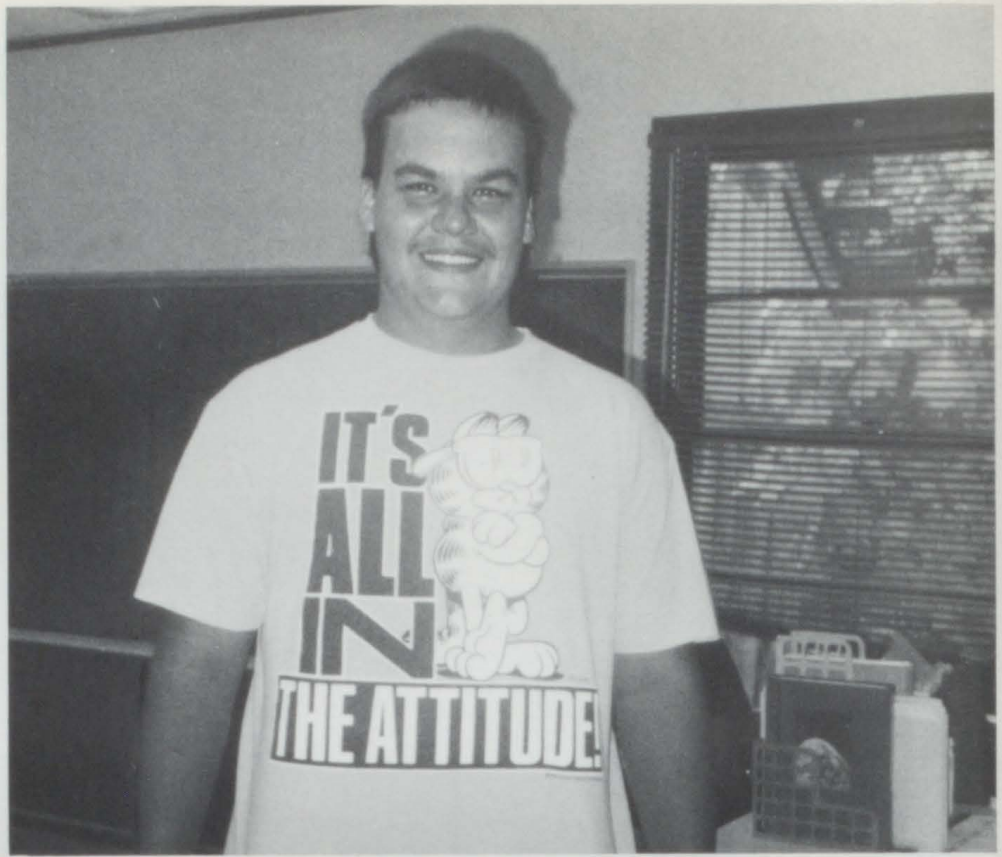

seven trophies for finishing in the top three positions during the regular season. They have also received two trophies for winning the championship during tournament season.

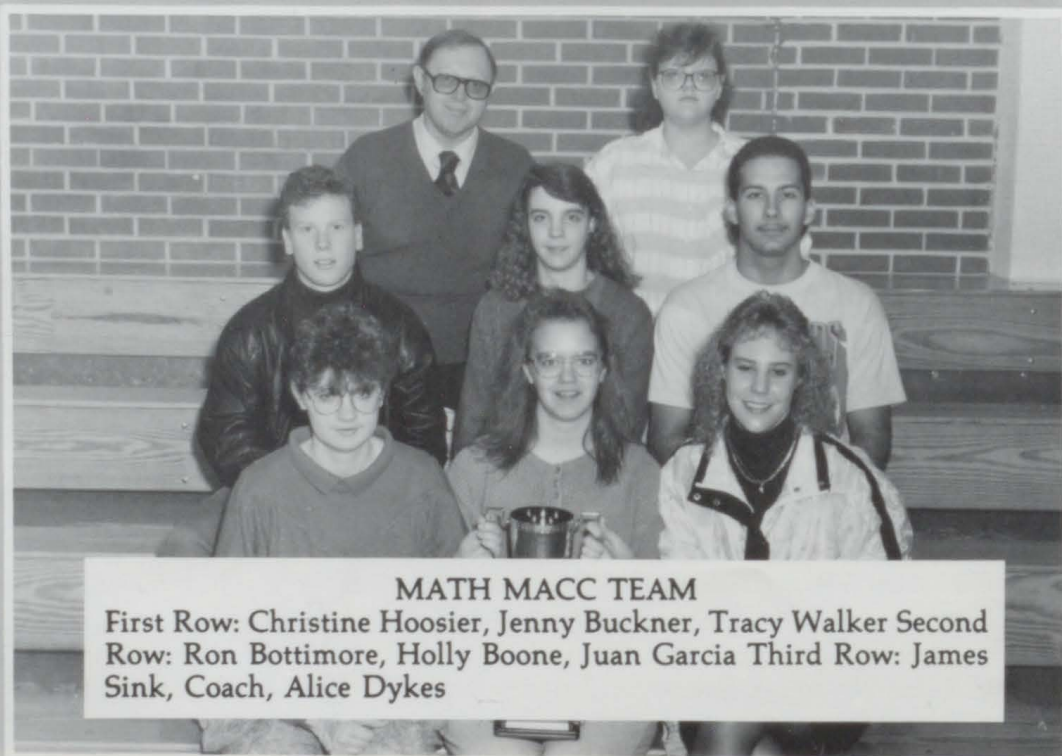
Last year, during the 1990-91 season, our Math MACC team won the championship for the

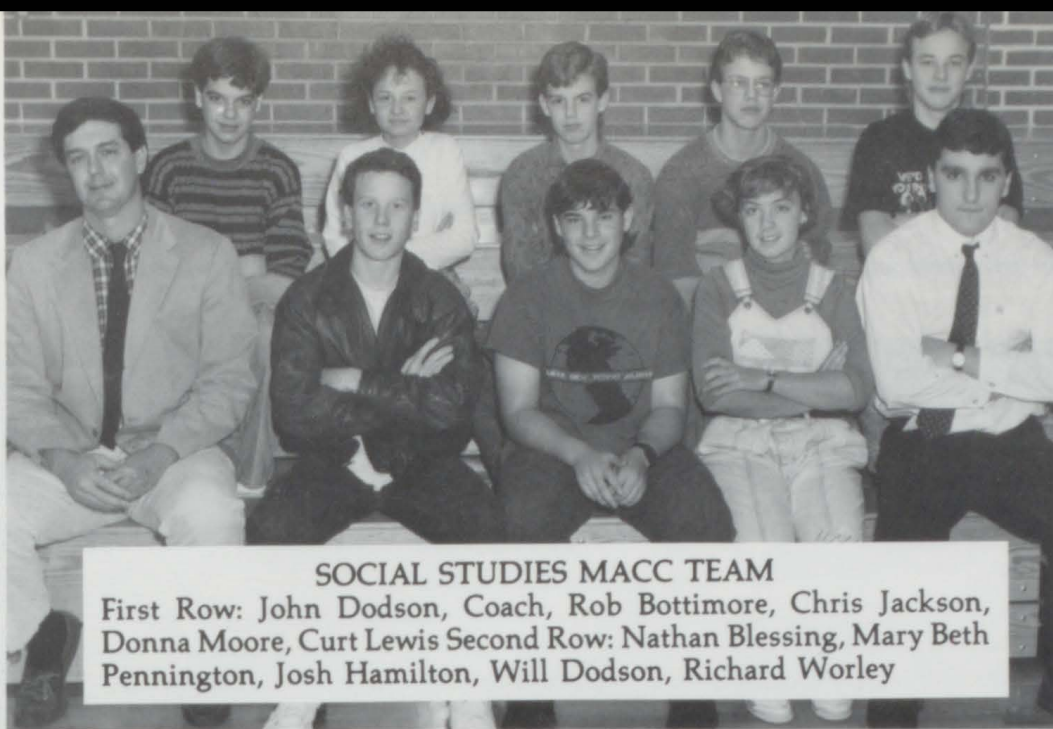

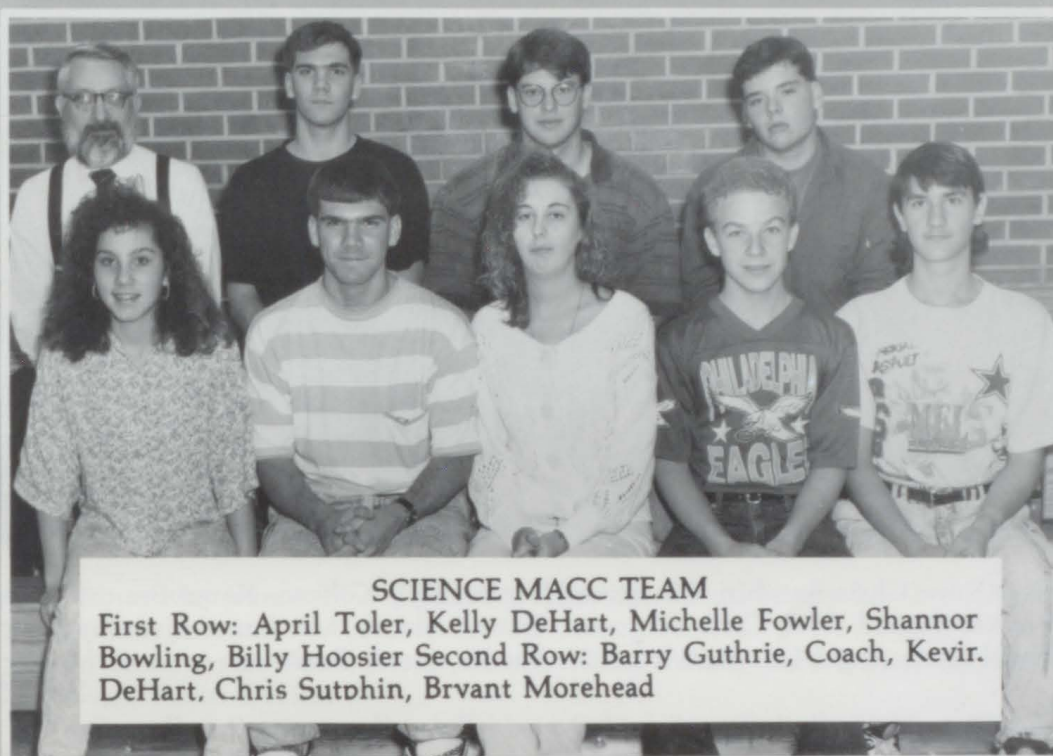

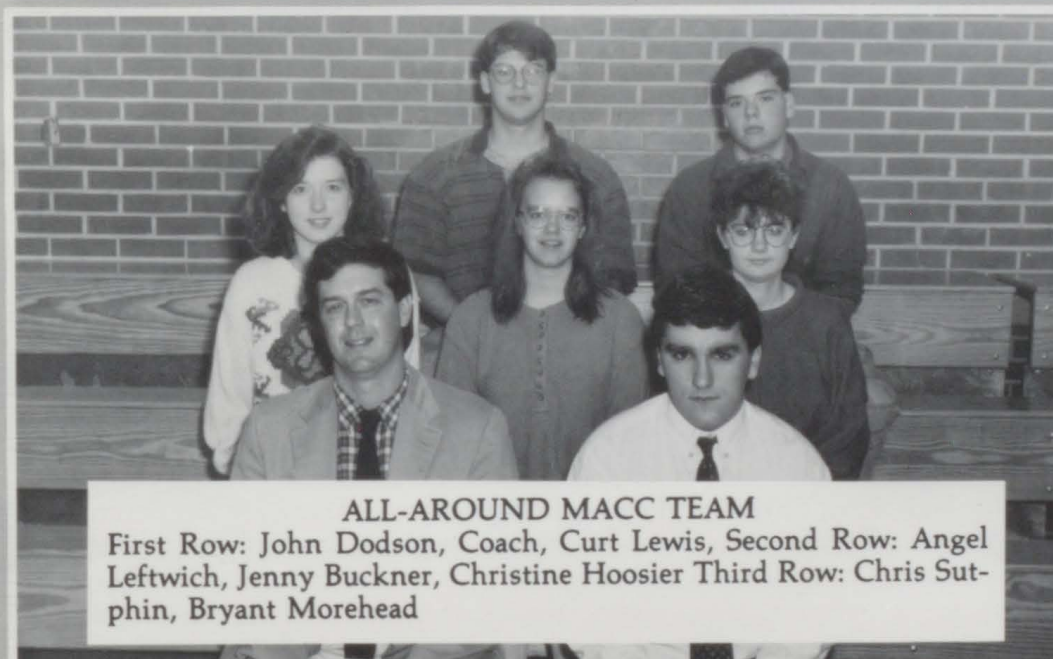

The DAR award is given by the Virginia Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The aim of the contest is to stress the qualities of good citizenship among senior high school students.

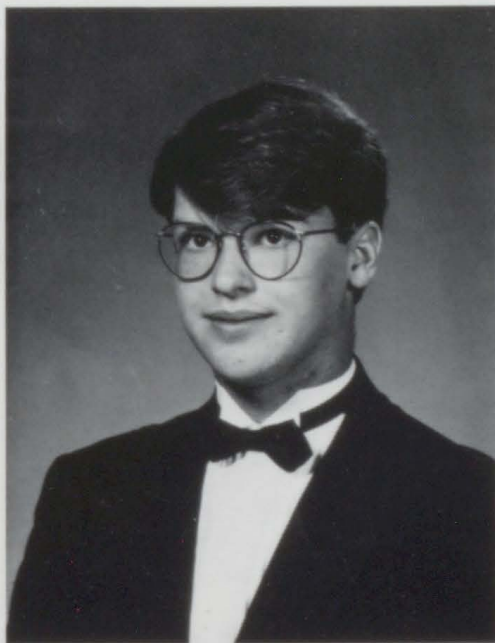
The recipient of the DAR Good Citizen award is to possess, to an outstanding degree, the following qualities: dependability, service, leadership, and patriotism.

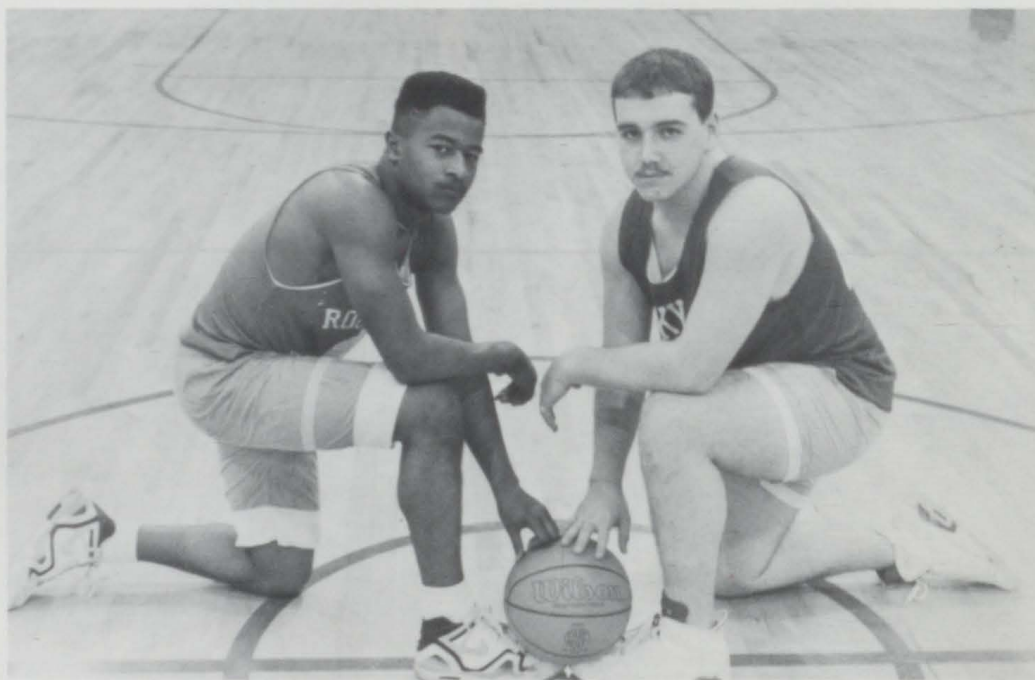
